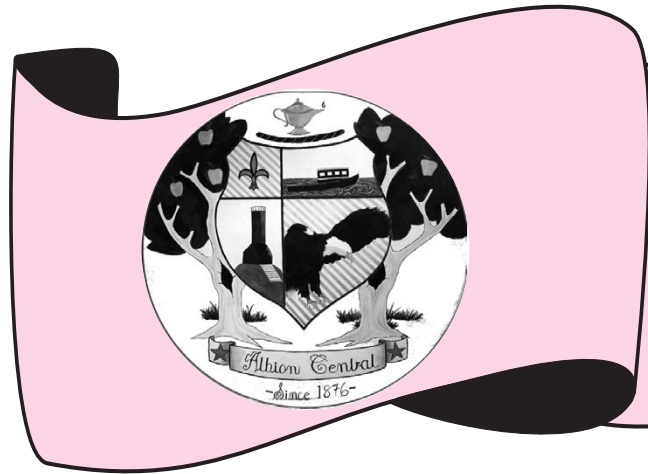


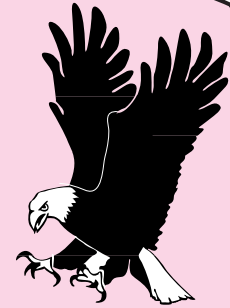

District-Wide Campus Tour Set for Tue., Aug. 30



All Albion Central School buildings will be open from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. on Tue., Aug. 30, for students and parents to tour the facilities and find their classrooms. Secretarial and administrative staff will be available to assist you with any questions.

New students to the district or students changing buildings are especially encouraged to visit their new building on this date. Students must be accompanied by a parent.

While schools are always open to parents, we do not encourage you to attend school with your child on the first day, Sept. 7. Instead, pre-visit with your child on Aug. 30.

Kindergarten Orientation

A special kindergarten orientation is planned for Aug. 31 from 9 a.m. - 12 p.m. in the Elementary School. Kindergarten teachers will be available to meet with the children. Snacks will be served.

Bus Preparedness

During the Aug. 31 Orientation, a school bus and driver will be located in front of the Elementary School for children to practice boarding and unloading procedures.

Teacher Open House

Teacher Open House is scheduled in each building after school begins in September. This is a time when you and your family can meet your child's teacher(s) and set up an appointment for parent conferences. Teacher Open House dates:

Elementary School (grades Pre-K, K, 1, 2):	September 22 (5-7 p.m.)
Elementary School (grades 3, 4, 5):	September 20 (5-7 p.m.)
Middle School (grades 6,7,8):	September 21 (6-8 p.m.)

Registration for New Students

Albion Central School registers new students in the registrar's office located in the district office, 324 East Ave., Albion.

Parents must register their children.

Please bring the child's ORIGINAL DOCUMENTATION: birth certificate or hospital certificate and record of immunization data.

NYS law requires that all children must be immunized against diphtheria, pertussis (whooping cough), tetanus, measles, rubella (German measles), poliomyelitis (polio), mumps and hepatitis B and varicella (chickenpox).

The following are minimum immunization requirements for school entry: (3) DPT (diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus); (3) polio (poliomyelitis); (2) MMR (measles, mumps, and rubella) - two doses of measles vaccine are required and are normally given as an MMR; (3) hepatitis B, and the varicella (chicken pox) vaccine. As of 9/1/07, students entering grades 6, 7, 8, 9 & 10 will need a Tdap Booster.

When applicable, a custody document must be provided if the student does not live with either natural parent. Only family court documents are accepted.

A copy of the last report card, copy of IEP (Individual Education Plan) if applicable, and address of school previously attended is appreciated for those who have attended school elsewhere.

ALL students entering Albion Central School District must have proof of a current physical. Examinations shall be acceptable if administered not more than twelve (12) months prior to the start of the school year.

ACSD Board of Education

The Board of Education meets the first Monday of each month at 7 p.m. (with limited exceptions) in the Elementary School, Conference Room A. These meetings are open to the public. Parking is available behind the district offices by the football field. Please enter through the doors marked "Community Entrance." If you would like to address the Board of Education, you must fill out a purple form, located at the conference room entrance, and give it to the Board secretary.

A Message from the Superintendent...

Welcome back! The 2011-2012 school year is just around the corner, with classes beginning for students on Wed., Sept. 7, 2011. The summer staff has worked hard to ensure that the schools are ready for our students' return, having cleaned, waxed, and freshened up the buildings. The middle school cafeteria will have received a significant makeover before opening day with the ceiling, walls, and floor all refinished. One wing of the elementary school will also be updated, in keeping with our rotation there.

In addition to facility changes, we have been busy selecting new staff members to fill some, but not all of our vacancies. Some positions will not be filled as we continue to operate with a conservative, responsible budget that balances the needs of our students with the ability of our taxpayers to fund our program. Speaking of budget, the Board of Education adopted the 2011-2012 tax rate at their August meeting. The district tax levy remains unchanged (as detailed when the community approved the school budget in May). Because of some minor increases in the tax rolls (the total assessed value of all property in the district) the tax rate will actually drop a bit for the coming year. This is the fifth year without an increase in the tax levy—and the \$16.84 rate is .13 percent lower than last year because of the assessment changes.

In the coming year, Greta Bohn will join us as a Speech Pathologist, replacing the retiring Barbara Dunham. Cathy Pepe and Sarah Williams were hired as teacher aides to replace Barbara Collyer and Christine Smith, who also retired. Kristie Campbell will move into the position Don Bemont's retired from while Robin Bower moves into the PACE position made available by Kathy Costello's retirement. In addition, the following individuals have retired: Deb Wilson in technical support, Susan Cummings in the elementary office, teacher aide Darlene Sullivan, and high school math teacher Barbara Navarra. We welcome our new personnel and wish each of our retirees well as they move on to new a new chapter in their lives.

In addition to preparing our buildings and filling our staff roster, we dedicated a great deal of time this summer to improving instruction and meeting new state mandates. To meet the new teacher evaluation mandate, administrators attend a three-day session advancing our schools in teacher evaluation. Teams of teachers and administrators met around our district's RtI (Response to Intervention) plan to ensure that struggling students receive the support they need. We have also been busy learning about the Common Core Standards - a series of learning standards developed and adopted by more than 30 states, including New York. These new standards will replace the current New York State Learning Standards.

We have also adjusted (with much happiness, I must add) to the return of the January Regents Exams. While the state had eliminated these in their original budget deliberations, private donors, including New York City mayor Michael Bloomberg have funded, at least for this year, their return. We are pleased with their return and will continue to lobby the state to offer them past the coming year.

It has been a busy summer, but we have missed our most important element: our students. We are excited about their return and look forward to their energy bringing the life of a vibrant learning community back to our campus!

New York State Education Law Health Examination Requirements

As part of a required school health examination, a student is weighed and his/her height is measured. Recent changes to the New York State Education Law require that districts now calculate students' body mass index (BMI) using this information. The BMI may help health care professionals determine if the student's weight is in a healthy range or is too high or too low. Please remember that this is only one measurement and is not used in isolation to make healthcare decisions. This information will remain confidential in each student's health record. This assessment will occur in grade Pre-K or Kindergarten, and in grades 2, 4, 7 and 10.

The State Education Department (SED) may select a number of districts to participate in a survey designed by the New York State Department of Health. If our school is selected to participate, we will be reporting specific information to the Department of Health. Districts will be responsible for sharing weight status information. No names and no information about individual students will be sent or shared. As the parent/guardian, you may choose to have your child's information excluded from this survey report. The information being sent to the NYS Department of Health will help to develop programs and services that make it easier for children to be healthier.

Sodoma Elementary School, (Pre-K – 5th grade)

The Ronald L. Sodoma Elementary School staff looks forward to another exciting year of learning. The first day of school for grades Pre-K through 5 is Wed., Sept. 7. Doors will open at 9 a.m.

Parent-Transported Students

Parents who plan on transporting their children to school should note: **STUDENTS SHOULD NOT ARRIVE PRIOR TO 9 a.m.**

All visitors will enter the main entrance at the front of the elementary school building (under the canopy by the "crayons"). Parking for visitors will be the northeast parking lot, in front of the playground. Student drop-off will be the parking lot via Clarendon Road.

If a student arrives prior to 9 a.m., he/she will wait in the lobby area until 9 a.m. Only students who attend before-school programs or breakfast will be allowed to enter the building prior to 9 a.m. In order to help keep our children safe, all doors to the building will be locked except the main lobby entrance. All visitors must sign in at that entrance. We appreciate your understanding regarding these security measures.

Pre-K Students

Pre-Kindergarten parents will receive a schedule in the mail of which day their child will be attending class during the first week of classes. The morning Pre-K class of students and their parents will be invited to attend an open house for them on Aug. 30 between 9 a.m. and 12 p.m. The afternoon Pre-K class will have their open house on Aug. 31 between 9 a.m. and 12 p.m.

Please park in the visitor parking lot and enter through the main entrance where you will sign in and receive a visitor's pass. You will then meet in your child's classroom. At the end of the session, you will take your child home with you.

The first regular session for Pre-K students will be on Wed., Sept. 9.

Kindergarten Students

Kindergarten students should report to the EAST GYM on the first day of school. Teachers will pick up their classes from this area. If you bring a kindergarten student to school, do not leave him/her at the classroom.

Parents are requested to keep and have their child wear the bus tag (received in the mail) the first two weeks of school. This helps staff to identify kindergartners.

Returning Students, Grades 1-5

Returning students in grades 1-5 should report to the classroom as assigned. Adults will be stationed throughout the building to assist and guide students to their classrooms.

New Students

New students should go to the school's main office. Staff members will be available to take your child to his/her new classroom.

Classroom Assignments

Classroom assignments will be mailed out on Mon., Aug. 17. We encourage all parents and students to visit the school on Campus Tour Day, Aug. 30 between 9 a.m. and 12 p.m. to help your child become familiar with the location of his/her classroom. For any parent unsure of their child's classroom assignment, they will also be available on that day at the Main Office.

Pick-Up & Dismissal

Generally, during the first few days of school, buses will run a little later than normal. Please be patient.

- The AM Pre-K class will be dismissed at 11:30 a.m.
- During the school year, dismissal will be at 3:20 p.m. for afternoon Pre-K and Grades K-5.
- Parents are requested not to disrupt the class by picking up a child prior to the 3:20 p.m. dismissal time. Student sign out will be in the main lobby in front of the building.
- Your cooperation in adhering to these times is appreciated.

During the **first few days of school**, **kindergarten children may be leaving their classroom ten minutes earlier than usual. This is to facilitate bus loading until the children become familiar with getting on the bus.**

Student Attendance

In order for students to succeed in school and meet state expectations, it is imperative that students maintain regular attendance. We ask parents and guardians to assist us in this matter. We will be completing home visits for students not in regular attendance.

Parent Handbook

On the first day of school all students will receive a "Parent Handbook". Please read it carefully and save it for further reference. This is an important resource.

Have You Moved Since Last June?

If you have moved over the summer, please call the elementary school (589-2030) and the bus garage (589-2070) to change your new address. We do not know when families move and must rely on families to inform us. Please call by Sept. 1 so we can make appropriate changes.

Do you have a child pick-up or drop-off location that is not your home?

If your child will be picked up and/or dropped off at a location other than your home (i.e. babysitter, grandparent, etc), you must fill out a transportation form. Even if your child was transported to the same location the prior year, you must fill out a form EACH YEAR. Please call the elementary school office at 589-2030 or stop in to pick up your form no later than Sept. 1.

Attention Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten parents:

Pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students will not be dropped off at their homes unless the bus driver sees an adult outside, in a window, or standing in the door. If a driver does not see an adult, the child will be brought back to school and the parent will have to call to come and pick up the child. If you want an older sibling to take your child off the bus, please go to the elementary school and fill out a permission form.

Bergerson Middle School, Grades 6 – 8**Opening of School**

Grade 7 and 8 students at the middle school will report to their homeroom at 7:43 a.m. At that time, students will be given their schedules for the year.

Grade 6 students will report to the middle school auditorium where they will be greeted by their teachers.

Dismissal will be at 2:23 p.m.

Late Arrivals/Leaving Early

For students leaving early, parents must write a note excusing the absence. The student must bring it PRIOR TO HOMEROOM to the MS Nurse's office to receive an "early dismissal pass." At the appointed time, the student reports to the office to await the person who will be signing him/her out. Students WILL NOT be allowed to leave the building on their own. If a parent is unable to pick up his/her child, then another adult (18 years or older and listed on the release form), may sign the student out.

Student Attendance

We will be completing home visits for students not in regular attendance. If he/she will not be in school, please call 589-2021 before 9 a.m. to report the absence.

Assignment Notebooks, etc.

During the first week of school, homeroom teachers will hand out assignment notebooks, and student handbooks to all students along with various forms that need to be filled out, signed by parents, and returned to their teachers. These forms MUST be returned by Sept. 12 so school personnel can finalize indexing of student information.

The student handbook should be taken home to parents to be read together, as it contains important information pertinent to both students and parents.

Included in the handbook is a listing of office phone numbers that parents will need to reach the appropriate office for absences, medical concerns, guidance concerns, and main office personnel. It may be helpful to post these numbers where they are easily accessible.

Breakfast

Breakfast will be available from 7:35 - 7:58 a.m. in the cafeteria. Students will not be admitted to breakfast after 7:38 a.m.

Community Parking

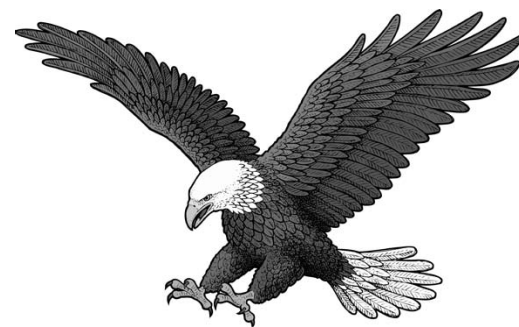

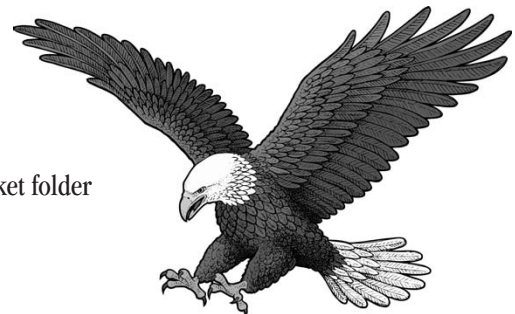

Notification of Rights Under the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA)

PPRA affords parents certain rights regarding our conduct of surveys, collection and use of information for marketing purposes, and certain physical exams. These include the right to:

Consent before students are required to submit to a survey that concerns one or more of the following protected areas ("protected information survey") if the survey is funded in whole or in part by a program of the U.S. Department of Education (ED)-

- Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student's parent;
- Mental or psychological problems of the student or student's family;
- Sex behavior or attitudes;

- Any non-emergency, invasive physical exam or screening required as a condition of attendance, administered by the school or its agent, and not necessary to protect the immediate health and safety of a student, except for hearing, vision, or scoliosis screenings, or any physical exam or screening permitted or required under State law;
- Activities involving collection, disclosure, or use of personal information obtained from students for marketing or to sell or otherwise distribute the information to others;
- Inspect, upon request and before administration or use;
- Protected information surveys of students;
- Instruments used to collect personal information from students for any of the above marketing, sales, or other distribution purposes; and
- Instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum.

These rights transfer from the parents to a student who is 18 years old or an emancipated minor under State law.

Albion Central School has developed and adopted policies, in consultation with parents, regarding these rights, as well as arrangements to protect student privacy in the administration of protected information surveys and the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information for marketing, sales, or other distribution purposes. Albion Central School will directly notify parents of these policies at least annually at the start of each school year and after any substantive changes. The Albion Central School will also directly notify, such as through U.S. Mail or email, parents of students who are scheduled to participate in the specific activities or surveys noted below and will provide an opportunity for the parent to opt his or her child out of participation of the specific activity or survey. The Albion Central School will make this notification to parents at the beginning of the school year if the District has identified the specific or approximate dates of the activities or surveys at that time. For surveys and activities scheduled after the school year starts, parents will be provided reasonable notification of the planned activities and surveys listed below and be provided an opportunity to opt their child out of such activities and surveys. Parents will also be provided an opportunity to review any pertinent surveys. Following is a list of the specific activities and surveys covered under this requirement:

- Collection, disclosure, or use of personal information for marketing, sales or other distribution.
- Administration of any protected information survey not funded in whole or in part by ED.
- Any non-emergency, invasive physical examination or screening as described above.

ATTENTION MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ID Swipe Cards Are Needed If You Attend School Events

Beginning September 2006, all middle and high school students are required to bring their Albion Central School District ID cards with them to all extracurricular school events. These events include football and basketball games, school plays and musicals. If a student does not bring his/her card to the event, he/she will not be allowed entrance to the event.

Students are ineligible to attend extracurricular events if they have been:

- Suspended from school
- Assigned to the correction room the week prior to an event for a 3 or 4 level offense outlined in the Code of Conduct
- Delinquent in payment of debts of \$5.00 or more (for lost books, lunches, etc.)
- Delinquent in payment of debts of less than \$5.00 that have been outstanding for more than 3 weeks (for lost books, lunches, etc). If this debt is a result of a hardship, please contact the Superintendent at 589-2050.
- Tardy three or more times in a quarter and/or absent six or more times in a quarter

Students who are illegally absent or tardy from school may not attend or participate in extracurricular activities on that day. All students are given an ID card when they begin school in September. This card is used during the school day to purchase lunches and take out library books. If a student should lose or break the card, or if it is not able to be scanned, there is a \$3.00 replacement fee for a new card.

Asbestos Inspection Information

In compliance with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), asbestos reinspections were performed in each of our school buildings for asbestos containing building materials. The inspection findings are in the asbestos management plan and are on file in each school administrative office and our central administration office.

The EPA requires us to perform periodic inspection every six months and triennial reinspections of the asbestos materials every three years. During the 2010 school year, the NYS Department of Labor (NYSDOL) certified asbestos inspector performed these reinspections and a certified NYSDOL asbestos planner reviewed the reinspection results. Six-month periodic inspections were also performed, submitted to the District and filed for review.

No significant findings were noted during the reinspection of our school buildings. All asbestos materials in our schools remain in good condition, and we will continue to manage them in place as recommended by EPA guidelines and the NYSDOL certified asbestos management planner.

Results of the inspection are on file in three locations: 1) the District Central Administrative Office, 2) the School Administrative Offices, and 3) the Superintendent of Maintenance & Operations Office.

SCHOOL LUNCHES AND CHARGING POLICY

The school district contracts with a company, Sodexo, to provide meals to our students. In cooperation with the company, the following "charge" policy was agreed upon:

- All students must use their student identification tags to enter all cafeteria transactions.
- Charging will be permitted for the first lunch ONLY.
- Children may not charge a second lunch or á la carte.
- A student can not charge a lunch for more than two days.
- The student must pay back for the lunches charged.
- All charges must be paid back before a la carte may be purchased.
- Students may pre-pay for lunches.

Cost for student lunches:

Elementary: \$ 1.25 Middle/High: \$ 1.25

Cost for additional items:

Milk: \$.55 Fruit Punch: \$.60
Ice Cream: \$.75 Cookies: \$.35 or 2 for \$.60
Pretzel Rod: \$.10 or 2 for \$.15

Elementary students may purchase ice cream on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Elementary students who have additional funds in their accounts can only use the funds for lunches and can not use funds to purchase ice cream, cookies or pretzels. Parents must send money for the purchase of these additional items. A school lunch consists of one entrée, three sides and one milk. Students may select á la carte items priced separately. PLEASE READ Important Bus Transportation Information

All students are eligible for busing. MS and HS students in the village will be picked up by bus **at corners**.

Please review the busing routes in this LINK issue to determine changes and where your child will be picked up.

Please keep in mind that for the first few days of school, the buses will be running a little later than normal in the afternoon. The schedule will adjust within a few days.

The parking lot on the north side of the Elementary school immediately in front of the building is for **bus parking ONLY**. If you are dropping off or picking up a student, please use the **Clarendon Street** entrance.

BUS GARAGE HOURS: Open during the school year from 6 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. After hours, please leave messages on voice mail at 589-2070.

If Your Child Will Be Transported To/From A Residence Other Than Your Home...

New York State Education Law obligates the District to transport students to and from their residence in accordance with defined limits. However, we understand that the babysitter's residence becomes the school bus stop for many of our students. ACSD will, therefore, honor requests for transportation to and/or from a point other than the family residence **on an annual basis**.

EACH YEAR, a transportation form must be completed to request transportation from an address other than your home.

Requests are honored one time only. The District and the parents are obligated to the agreement for the entire school year. **The District will not approve bus stops on differing days for any individual student or adjust a student's bus assignment after the beginning of the school year unless you change your residence.** This determination is based on the District's requirement to ensure safe and secure transportation for every student. Emergency or extenuating circumstances shall be handled through respective building principals. The District is prohibited from transporting students to after-school organizations such as Scouts, 4-H, dancing class, music lessons, or to a friend's house. Requests of this nature are not considered "emergencies" and will not be honored by the District. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to provide transportation to and from these non-school related activities.

If you want the bus to pick up or drop off your child at a residence other than your own home, you MUST fill out a transportation form EACH YEAR. Forms can be obtained at each building office. Information can not be accepted over the phone. Parent notes regarding bus changes are not accepted. **A form must be filled out no later than Sept. 1.** If applications are received later than that date, it may take up to one week to process them. If you have questions, please call the District at 589-2056 or the bus garage at 589-2070.

Waiting for the Bus:

All students must be outside in a visible location **TEN (10) minutes before** the scheduled bus arrival time. When substitute drivers are placed on a route, they do not have house numbers of students. They are given the streets to pick up/drop off. Substitutes look for children standing by the road for pick up. **Buses are not allowed to honk their horns for students to catch the bus.**

Important Information for Pre-K & Kindergarten Student Transportation Home: **Pre-kindergarten students** will not be dropped off at their homes unless the bus driver sees an adult outside, in a window or standing in the door. If a driver does not see an adult, the child will be brought back to school and the parent will have to come and pick up the child.

Kindergarten students will not be dropped off at their home unless the bus driver sees an adult at home or they are riding with an older sibling. Kindergarteners will be dismissed at 3:20 p.m. and will ride the Elementary School Bus home. The buses leave the Elementary School at 3:30 p.m.

Attention Oak Orchard Estate Students

Bus Stops will be at the Main office parking lot or by the mailboxes on North Street.

ATTENTION MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS Staying After School

Late-bus riders this year will share the afternoon bus run with the Elementary School students. This privilege will only be available on a limited basis for students who have a bus pass from a teacher or building administrator. This bus run leaves the Elementary School at 3:30 p.m.

Allow us to explain the procedure:

Please keep in mind that Fall sports physicals are conducted in May, therefore some of the verbiage below will be inaccurate when referring to "4-5 weeks prior to the start of the season," etc.

Sign-ups - The nurses will generally begin sign-ups 4-5 weeks prior to the start of each season. The students will sign up on a list provided by their second-block teacher. If a student misses the sign-up it is his or her responsibility to stop down to the nurse's office.

AD Meeting with Athletes - The goal of this meeting is to inform the athletes that they need to take care of each task within the time frames given; there needs to be a sense of urgency to complete each task. Also, students may sign up for a sport at this time.

Preliminary Evaluations - The nurses will conduct the prelims to get the athletes ready to see the doctor. The athletes need to honor all passes from the nurse.

Coaches Meetings - One week prior to the physicals being conducted by the school doctor coaches will hold their pre-season meeting to make sure all athletes are set with having their physical the following Wednesday.

Private Physicals - Athletes are allowed to have private physicals. However, they will only be accepted up until the Friday before the scheduled physical date by the school doctor.

Physical by School Doctor - Usually given the Wednesday before the season starts.

Interval Health History Forms - These forms will be handed out at the first scheduled practice by the coach and must be returned at the beginning of the third scheduled practice. If it isn't turned in the athlete will not practice.

Health History Forms (yellow form) - This form must be turned in to the nurse prior to the student's physical.
